BREAST CANCER IS THE MOST FREQUENTLY DIAGNOSED CANCER AMONG WOMEN IN AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND. IN 2025, IT'S PREDICTED THAT **OVER 20,440 PEOPLE** WILL BE DIAGNOSED WITH BREAST CANCER IN AUSTRALIA, AND **OVER 3,500 PEOPLE** WILL BE DIAGNOSED WITH BREAST CANCER IN NEW ZEALAND.

BREAST CANCER IS THE MOST DIAGNOSED CANCER FOR WOMEN AGED 20-39 AND 40-59.


APPROXIMATELY 56 PEOPLE ARE DIAGNOSED WITH BREAST CANCER EVERY DAY IN AUSTRALIA, AND APPROXIMATELY 9 PEOPLE ARE DIAGNOSED EVERY DAY IN NEW ZEALAND.

WHILE MORE PEOPLE ARE BEING DIAGNOSED WITH BREAST CANCER EACH YEAR, WITH IMPROVED SCREENING AND AWARENESS, MORTALITY RATES ARE DECREASING THANKS TO BREAST CANCER RESEARCH.

MORTALITY

IN 2025, IT IS ESTIMATED THAT **OVER 3,300 PEOPLE** WILL DIE FROM BREAST CANCER IN AUSTRALIA. THAT MEANS **9 AUSTRALIANS** DIE FROM BREAST CANCER EVERY DAY.

IN NEW ZEALAND, APPROXIMATELY **630 PEOPLE** WILL DIE FROM BREAST CANCER.
